Kathy Loughridge's mum was cared for at the Marie Curie Hospice in Belfast, and her sister Ann by Marie Curie Nurses at home, after they were both diagnosed with terminal cancer.

"It's hard to describe the pain of losing half my family so quickly – it took a long time to come to terms with our loss.

"I wanted to do something to repay Marie Curie for their care and compassion. I've learnt that life does go on and from a very bad situation, good can happen. It's a wonderful feeling to give back and help other families."

Kathy's walk raised £9,000, which could fund 391 hours of Marie Curie nursing care. Her family have also organised a fashion show, a zip wire across the Lagan and a mud run to raise money.

Boost your fundraising





This is the quickest and simplest way to let people know you're raising money. Visit **justgiving.com/mariecurie** and follow the instructions to get started. By adding a target, photo and story about why you're fundraising for Marie Curie, you could raise 40% more!



Organise a sweepstake

A sweepstake is a really easy way to add a bit of competitive fun to your fundraising. You can start with something simple like guessing how many sweets are in a jar. You'll find a sweepstake sheet included in this pack.



Bring in businesses

Reach out to local businesses and see if they'd be willing to help. They could match your donations to double your fundraising efforts or let you use their space to host your fundraiser.







Find out how your local community centre could get involved or support you with your fundraiser. This would be a great place to leave a collection tin or bucket you could collect on a weekly basis. Get in touch with us at fundraising@mariecurie.org.uk to request a tin.



Make it personal

Send a personalised message or video to your friends and family telling them what you're doing and why, so that they can support you.



Gift Aid it

Gift Aid allows charities like Marie Curie to claim 25p for every £1 you donate. That's a whole 25% on top of what you raise. Make sure that when people donate, they complete the Gift Aid declaration on your sponsor form, JustGiving page or the donation form included in this pack.

Shout about it



Well, not literally – unless you want to! Sharing your fundraiser on social media can send your donations soaring.

Here's how you can do it:

- 1. Keep reminding people what you're doing by sharing your JustGiving page if you have one.
- 2. Post in any group chats you're a part of and ask members to donate.
- 3. Share your fundraising page with your networks on social media. Start a hashtag on Twitter or Instagram to track your progress and increase your reach.
- 4. Take loads of photos of your fundraiser to share afterwards.
- 5. Thank people for donating. It means a lot and might remind someone else to donate too!

Safety first

Whatever you're planning, it's vital that you keep safe and legal. So let's go through some health and safety basics.

Raffles

Raffles are a great way to drum up funds, but make sure you're aware of the legalities beforehand. Find the latest advice and guidance at gamblingcommission.gov.uk

Food hygiene

Whether you're selling cupcakes or putting on a three-course dinner, food safety laws will apply. Check in with **food.gov.uk** to be on the safe side.

Collecting money

If you're carrying out public street collections yourself, you'll need to obtain a licence from your local council first. We recommend that another person is present when you're counting donations.

Insurance and licensing

Although we're here to help, we aren't responsible for your event and can't accept any liability. We recommend that you check with your local authority whether you need any special licences.

After Chan's husband received one night of care from a Marie Curie Nurse, she's been soaring to great heights in support of Marie Curie.

"At 10pm exactly the Marie Curie Nurse walked in the door," she recalled. "We sat in the lounge, and I probably talked to that lady more than I've talked to anybody."

Chan's wing walk raised over £5,500 – which could fund 239 hours of nursing care.
