Key Challenges and Take-aways

Communication between healthcare providers

- Slow
- Varies by locality
- Formal and informal methods

Medication Documentation

- Complexity increasing mistakes
 - · Delaying care
- Responsiveness to patient care
- Provider frustration
- Legibility across localities

Medication availability and access

- Dispensing and transporting
- Difficult to access pharmacy at certain times
- Burden faced by caregivers (if the patient has)
